## Definition:

Under general supervision performs a variety of routine, semi-skilled, technical and manual labor work in the operation, maintenance and repair of the sanitary sewer collection system and Wastewater Treatment Plant.

## Example of Duties:

- 1. Performs various work as assigned by supervisor relating to operation and maintenance of the sanitary sewer collection system and WWTP.
- 2. Performs all aspects of sampling, monitoring and testing required to maintain compliance with Federal, State and Local regulations governing the wastewater treatment processes.
- 3. Assists in projecting needs for equipment, materials, and supplies. Assists in the preparation of specifications, estimates, and bids for machinery and equipment.
- 4. Operates pickup, van and CCTV camera equipment, hydro flusher, dump truck, backhoe, garbage truck, lawn mower as used in relation to operation of facility.
- 5. Uses a variety of hand and power tools, such as welder, cutting torch, and chain saw.
- 6. Performs basic calculations involving plant operations.
- 7. Performs grounds maintenance, general building cleaning, maintenance and repair, vehicle and equipment maintenance.
- 8. Performs all duties in conformance to appropriate safety and security standards.
- 9. Performs required lab testing procedures and prepares reports as required by state and federal regulations.
- 10. Performs required labor involved in operation and maintenance projects as part of a crew.
- 11. Respond to public inquires in a courteous manner; provides information within scope of knowledge or refer to other PUD staff.
- 12. Maintain written records of inspections, maintenance activity, repairs, etc.
- 13. Is familiar with applicable state and local law and ordinances.

- 14. Is subject to 24-hour call-out duty.
- 15. Must be able to lift 75 pounds.

## Preferred Qualifications:

- 1. High school diploma or G.E.D.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge and skill in operation and maintenance of electrical motors and pumps.
- 3. Possess valid driver's license.
- 4. Possess a Class "A" Commercial Driver's License.
- 5. Basic knowledge of equipment, facilities, materials, methods, and procedures used in operation and maintenance of wastewater treatment facility.
- 6. Basic knowledge of building maintenance methods.
- 7. Knowledge of safety practices and procedures applicable to assigned work.
- 8. Knowledge of care, maintenance and safe operation of assigned equipment.
- 9. Knowledge of confined space regulations.
- 10. Skill in operation of listed tools and equipment.
- 11. Ability to perform heavy manual tasks for extended periods of time, often in diverse weather conditions.
- 12. Ability to work safely; ability to work independently in performing regularly assigned duties; ability of communicate effectively verbally; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with employees, other departments and the public; ability to understand and carry out written and oral instructions. Ability to respond to emergencies on a 24-hour basis. Requires some weekend and overtime hours.
- 13. Class B CDL with air brake endorsement and tank vehicle endorsement (Must obtain within one (1) year of employment).
- 14. Washington State Level 1 Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Certification. (Must obtain within one (1) year of employment).
- 15. First Aid/CPR Certification.
